FLC's are one of my favourite times of the Kin year. It is a great opportunity to reconnect with our fellow Kin from across the District, a time to learn, and a time to ready ourselves for the year ahead. Some of my best memories in Kin are at an FLC, and I hope that you too, can make some great memories over the weekend.

The National Board of Directors (NBoD) is also starting our 2023/24 Kin year. At our first meeting in September, we identified and discussed top priorities, one of which is to hire a permanent Executive Director (ED) as soon as possible. Interim ED Carmen Preston, HRF will continue to be an integral part of the team and we will be relying on her extensive knowledge and skills during the onboarding of a new Executive Director in the coming months as she returns to the position of Kin Canada's Operations Manager — a position she has held for an incredible 35 years!

The NBoD is also still working on our Association's accreditation with Imagine Canada. As a result of this, we continue our thorough review of our governing documents, the National Policies and Procedures of the Association (NPPA) and the Governing Operating Bylaw #2 (GOB). We will be looking for your feedback and engagement regarding all policy changes, so please keep an eye out for those opportunities.

Another of the major goals for the NBoD is to increase our communication with you, our club members. You will see the return of Inside the Boardroom and more frequent updates on a variety of our communication avenues.

Kin Canada's two working groups – the Revenue Generation Working Group (RGWG) and the Operating Model Review Working Group (OMG) also continue to meet regularly and are working hard to achieve goals set out for them in their Terms of Reference (TORs).

The Revenue Generation Working Group (RGWG) is currently exploring a pilot project in Ontario and continues to seek other opportunities to help offset operating costs for our Association. If you have ideas about alternative sources of revenue for Kin Canada or you would like to join the working group, please contact National Director Ryan McClinchey (rmcclinchey@kincanada.ca).

The Operating Model Working Group (OMG) continues to meet weekly to help us move Kin Canada forward and position ourselves to be Canada's National Service Organization. Thanks to your enthusiastic engagement with the OMG, there has been lots of data collected. Your input has been invaluable to the OMG and is actively being utilized. OMG Focus Groups will begin soon, and the working group will also distribute an external survey to Canadians shortly. If you are interested in joining a focus group, please contact Joanna Low (jlow@kincanada.ca) for more information. The OMG is also currently seeking to increase the diversity of voices within the working group, so please reach out to Joanna if you are interested in joining.

As your National President, I am looking forward to helping support the work that your club does. Please reach out if you would like me to send a greeting (letter or video) or to attend a function in person. Also don't forget to nominate an outstanding Kin member for the National President's Recognition Award. Nomination forms are found on iKin.ca under Recognition Awards. I look forward to my District Tours of District 3 and District 6 this year and can't wait to see for myself the impact you have on your communities and see how you can INTENSIFY what you do this Kin year.

Welcome everyone to FLC 2023 and thank you to DG Gary and his team for hosting us here at the Debert Hospitality Centre this weekend. May all the delegates enjoy meeting new friends and renewing long time friendships. To all the first timers welcome! Along with the fellowship may everyone take this opportunity to participate in the seminars, service projects and fellowship.

Since the new Kin year started, I have provided each of the DG's with a service binder and spoke with them individually by phone. Included in the binder is contact information for our service partners, District and National service awards criteria and information on CF, MS, Canadian Blood Services, Organ & Tissue Donation, National Disaster Relief Fund, Kin Canada Bursaries (HERF), Kin Kindness Day and the Kin Canada Foundation. There is also information on fundraising strategies to assist clubs with promotion and increased fundraising revenue hints for your projects.

Last year District 7 had an increase in total service dollars and hours under Past Service Director Nancy. We were also the first district to report 100% of clubs reporting total service dollars hours in 2022/23. Thanks LM Nancy for your leadership last year. My hope this year is that we continue this upward trend in donations and service hours.

I am pleased to report that D7 had 10 Kin Canada Bursaries awarded to students here in Atlantic Canada. Congratulations to all the bursary recipients and thank you to every club that sent in submissions for consideration. This year 2023/24 we are celebrating long time partnerships with both CF Canada and MS Canada. Since Kin Canada first partnered in 1964 with CF, our association has donated over \$50M to finding a cure for Cystic Fibrosis. Great strides have been made, but we must continue the fight to achieve "A World without CF". Our district partnership with Multiple Sclerosis began 45 years ago in 1978. Over this time we have contributed approximately \$2.75M and leveraged over \$3.1M including the MS Walks that Kin Clubs of Antigonish and New Glasgow used to organize. The D7 Kin Family has and will continue to make a difference serving our partners.

I am happy to report the CF Canada – Ultimate NHL Road Trip Raffle Ticket Draw has returned again this year beginning Oct. 30th to Feb. 1, 2024. CF has done a great deal of work to prepare for this fundraiser. For those clubs who have participated in the past, i hope you will be "on board" again this year. Clubs, who have never participated in the past, please consider getting involved this year. The only cost to your club is a little effort and time. The tickets make an excellent Christmas gift or stocking stuffer for any hockey fan and the raffle is only open to residents in Atlantic Canada.

REPORT OF THE CREDENTIALS CHAIR

Governor Vicki, Fellow Kin,

Voting shall be per National Policy and Procedures of the Association – Chapter 3: Meetings of Members (Conventions):

- a) As members of the Association, Clubs are entitled to vote at all National, District and Zone conventions/conferences only through individual registered Accredited Delegates (or Alternate Accredited Delegates as applicable), duly appointed by the Club, to vote on the Club's behalf.
- b) For normal "show of hands" votes, each Club is entitled to ONE vote only, regardless of the number of members of that Club who are present, to be exercised only by the Club's registered Accredited Delegate (or Accredited Alternate Delegate as applicable);
- c) For the purposes of poll and ballot votes only, the number of votes to which a Club is entitled is equal to the club's Official Membership. Official membership means the total number of a Club's Active Members registered on the National membership roster as of:
 - i. In the case of a National Convention/Meeting of Members, June 30th immediately prior to the start of the Convention; and
 - ii. In the case of a District convention, Zone conference or other Special Meeting of Members, the month end date that is more than thirty-five (35) days prior to the start of the convention, conference or Meeting.

OPERATING MODEL REVIEW WORKING GROUP (OMG)

PROGRESS REPORT TO FALL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCES

The Operating Model Review Working Group (OMG for short) has completed the first phase of its consultations with Kin Canada members and staff. We have analysed the data collected at each of the District Conferences across the Association in spring 2023, and have identified key themes uncovered during the data collection process.

Not surprisingly, except for some expected regional variations, the positive feelings, concerns and challenges identified during the data collection process appear reasonably consistent across the Association. In particular, members expressed concerns about the following:

- Declining membership, and the difficulties encountered in recruiting new members, and engaging and retaining existing members;
- The high cost of membership resulting from membership dues/fees levied at all levels of the Association;
- Travelling distances between clubs (in districts with larger geographical footprints);
- Resistance to change and letting go of arcane traditions;
- Member support from HQ staff;
- Association structure and hierarchy
- Ongoing education and personal development of members; and
- Diversity, equity, and inclusivity.

The OMG will be taking many of these key themes on board as they move forward to examine ways in which the members' concerns may be addressed to deliver a better experience as part of the Association. In the coming months, the OMG will be conducting a series of focus groups to further investigate, and find potential solutions to, the following areas of concern:

- Association structure and leadership
- Service and partnerships
- Diversity, equity and inclusivity
- Traditions
- Fee structure
- Recruitment and retention
